

U.S. VISA VACCINATION CHECKLIST

For the attention of the general practitioner: Check the presence of the name and date of birth; update vaccinations and record them in the right-hand column with the date indicated; Sign and stamp each.

		VACCINE NAME, DATE OF VACCINATION, SIGNATURE AND STAMP
Covid-19	2 doses are now mandatory for everyone from 5 years old. Bring 2 printed papers with the 2 dates of vaccination against Covid-19. No QR code accepted. Your file will be blocked without proof of the 2 dates.	
Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio	To do all 4 if no booster for 10 years (for example REPEVAX) Special case: It is necessary to have had a poliomyelitis booster in the last 4 to 52 if you live or have spent more than 4 weeks in Afghanistan, Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, Egypt, Ethiopia, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Iran, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritania, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Republic of Congo, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, South Sudan, Tajikistan, Uganda, Ukraine and Yemen.	
Hepatitis B	If under 60 years old. 3 doses – the second ON D+1 month and third on D+6 months. At least one vaccine before the visit	
Rubella, mumps, measles (MMR)	To do if you were born from 1957 onwards. 2 doses with more than a year apart. At least 1 before the visit. If there is no written proof of vaccination, YOU should get vaccinated or have a blood test to see if you are immune to the 3 diseases. Ask your doctor for a prescription. If you are only immune to 1 or 2 of these diseases, you must be vaccinated again with MMR. Individual vaccines do not exist. A history of rubella, mumps, measles is not enough as proof. Contraindicated vaccine in pregnancy	
Chickenpox	If there is no written proof of vaccination, you should get vaccinated or have a blood test to see if you are immune. Ask your doctor for a prescription. A history of chickenpox will only suffice if you have the date noted by a doctor. Contraindicated vaccine in pregnancy	
Seasonal flu	The vaccine is mandatory during the flu season (early October to late January or as long as the vaccine remains available in pharmacies. Check availability with your pharmacist.	
Pneumococcus	The pneumococcal vaccine is mandatory from the age of 65 . U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) calls for first vaccination with PPSV23 pneumococcal vaccine
